

Saddle Peak (Diglipur)

The highest point in the Andamans & Nicobars, with breathtaking views, dense evergreen forests, and a true wilderness adventure.



Mount Manipur

Find beautiful butterflies, tropical birds like Andaman woodpeckers and drongos, and sometimes even monitor lizards



Munda Pahad

The gentle uphill trail opens out to a cliff-top viewpoint overlooking the vast blue expanse of the Bay of Bengal, offering one of the most stunning sunset views.

TIDAL WALKS

Tidal walks in the Andaman Islands offer a fascinating glimpse into the hidden world of marine life revealed during low tide. Starfish, sea cucumbers. shells. eels. Octopus, different types of corals can be spotted in natural rock pools and sandy shallows. Some famous locations to witness this are Swarai Dweep, Shaheed Dweep, Burmanallah, Mayabunder.



THE EDGE OF THE EXTRAORDINARY

JOLLY BUOY



Jolly Buoy Island is famous for its crystalclear waters, colorful coral reefs, and rich marine life, it offers activities like glassbottom boat rides that let visitors explore the underwater beauty.

ROSS & SMITH ISLAND

Located near Diglipur in North Andaman, these islands are famous for their crystal-clear turquoise waters, powdery white sands, and lush tropical forests. Visitors can walk across the sandbar, swim, snorkel, or simply relax in the serene surroundings.



RED SKIN



The island is known for its colorful corals, clear blue waters, and rich marine life, making it a popular spot for glass-bottom boat rides. Embark on a scenic trekking trail through the forest and catch a glimpse of endemic birds from the watch tower.

CINQUE ISLAND

Cinque Island, often called the "Twin Island Paradise" of the Andamans, is made up of two islands joined by a narrow sandbar that vanishes with the tides. Famous for rich marine life — including turtles, giant groupers, and reef sharks.
